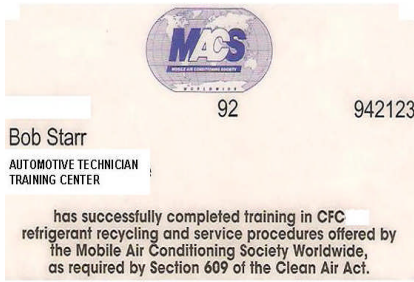

EPA Section 609 Refrigerant Recycling and Recovery Certification Program

EPA Section 609 certification is a requirement of the United States Clean Air Act of 1990. It is a requirement for purchasing R-12 refrigerant and recovering R134a refrigerant. Section 609 certification is good for life under current U.S. law. .

Any Technician Working For “Consideration” Being Paid, Which Also Includes Credit, Goods, Or Services And Opening The Refrigerant Circuit Of A Mobile A/C System, Must Be Certified By An Approved Agency To Legally Do So

Since 1990, more than 600,000 technicians have already completed the MACS EPA Section 609 certification program. The MACS program has been approved by the U.S. EPA to meet technician certification requirements under EPA Section 609 of the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990. It is designed to help you comply with the law, protect the environment and conserve the supply of CFC-12 for future service. The technician is the key to the successful implementation of on-site refrigerant recovery and recycling. This program is designed to encourage proper equipment use and service procedures. The MACS certification program also includes information on HFC-134a refrigerant recovery and recycling procedures,
